Skiers under surveillance

"The reaction of the people has been better than expected" Larose said, "People are very curious. I've seen families and various skiers do the same trail the whole night. It's been really great."

The artist said that his idea began with the idea of interactivity on the mountain, but said that he felt challenged by the scale of things. Though the average skier might not notice it in speeding down the hill, he explained, the geography of a ski trail is quite spread out and therefore difficult to make one integrated artwork on.

It was the idea of surveillance, and automated spotlights, that brought the whole idea together for him.

"In today's society, we're always being watched through our phones, our credit cards, and all that," Larose said. "We're a bit used to it now, so this is a way of directly experiencing it, bringing it back into focus, and questioning it."

Larose pointed out there are two animators stationed at the top of the ski run so that people are not flying blind when they get to the installation, and added that the lights are only on the right side of the run so that people can stay out of the spotlight if they don't like the idea.

The response, however, has been really positive.

"It's so fun for people," the artist said. Both Larose and Ménard spoke really highly of the collaboration between the artist and the mountain. So much so, in fact, that the marketing director suggested that Bromont would be open to a more large scale installation in the future

"If it responds to our growth objectives, we will consider different options," Ménard said, stressing that the mountain is always open to innovative ideas. "Ideally we would have multiple illuminated trails."

In the mean time, however, Ménard pointed out that there is still one more chance available to go participate in "Surveillance" on the last Nuit Blanche of the year which will take place March 18
