Sherblues & Folk shuts down Wellington South

he City of Sherbrooke is reminding the public that Wellington Street South between King West and Sanborn streets will be closed as of today, July 4 at 8:00 a.m. until July 10 at noon and Wellington Street North will be closed from July 5 at 8:00 a.m. until noon Monday, July 10 to allow for the Sherblues & Folk music festival.

The City suggests using King West, Peel, Marquette and Frontenac streets to bypass Wellington North and King Street, Grandes-Fourches South, Aberdeen, Laurier, and Ball to avoid Wellington South.

It should also be noted that parking will be prohibited overnight July 4-5 on Wellington North, between King West and Albert.
