## Quebec supports Bromont Summit Park project

The Government of Quebec is providing the City of Bromont with a grant of up to \$4 million to finance the purchase of private land for the Bromont Summit Park project. The project aims to protect the local natural environment while increasing public access to the land, pursuing both recreational and tourism objectives.

The grant was announced by Minister for Rehabilitation, Youth Protection, Public Health and Healthy Lifestyles and Minister responsible for the Montérégie region, Lucie Charlebois, on behalf of the Minister of Sustainable Development, Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change, Isabelle Melançon and Minister of Tourism and Minister responsible for the Mauricie region, Julie Boulet.

The park project will involve the creation of a 150 hectares nature park by the city and its regional partners. The park will help with conservation of the ecologically distinct summit environment while remaining accessible to the public through a network of trails covering approximately 34 kilometers. In addition to completing the financial package for the acquisition of the land for the future park, the government's contribution will also provide the site with recreational and tourist infrastructures, including a reception pavilion and a maple-themed museum/rest stop.

The targeted site includes a valley formed by the peaks of Mounts Spruce and Bernard, the highest in the Mount Brome Massif.

The government will contribute up to \$2.4 million from the Ministry of Sustainable Development, Environment and the Fight against Climate Change, and \$1,589,900 from the Ministry of Tourism in the framework of the Support for Tourism Development Strategies Program.
