Sherbrooke launches formal call for Wellington South projects

Record Staff SHERBROOKE

The City of Sherbrooke launched its call for proposals for the development of a project to replace the defunct Well Inc. plan in the Wellington St. South area.

The call for proposals is intended for Quebec promoters with a minimum of 15 years experience in the realization of real estate projects.

Projects submitted must include the demolition of existing structures and the preparation of the site. A public multi-storey parking lot must also be provided as well as a public square. An area of at least 70,000 sq. ft. must also be reserved for the Entrepreneurship Headquarters, whose main building will have a minimum of four storeys and a maximum of ten.

Beyond these specifications, the City has drawn up a wish list. It would like the public square to exceed 20,000 sq. ft and the parking lot should have at the least 650 spaces. Parking access should be via both Depot and Wellington South. Moreover, the project should become a strong and significant link integrating the principles of universal accessibility CONT'D ON PAGE 3
