Covering the next five years, the policy's theme is "Culture at heart: Working together for a rich and thriving cultural life."

The action plan includes facilitating the mobilization and involvement of citizens in the development of arts and culture, supporting initiatives that promote synergy within the community, increasing the visibility and communication of existing artistic activities and events, and supporting the preservation and promotion of the town's historical and social heritage.

"The committee involved in developing this policy has done a

tremendous amount of work over the past year," said Richard Burcombe, Mayor of Town of Brome Lake. "We have a vibrant and engaged arts community and a valuable cultural heritage."

"While supporting our artists, the cultural policy will create new connections, particularly between our three cultural institutions, namely the Theatre Lac-Brome, the Pettes Memorial Library and the Lac-Brome Museum," said Louise Morin,

Town Councillor in charge of culture. "It will take us to another level and position us well for the future."

Brome Lake adopted its first cultural policy in 2011. Officially approved at the regular Council meeting of October 4, the revised policy is available for consultation at ville.lac-brome.qc.ca/cultural-policy-2.

Judicial recount to be held in Brome— Missisquoi

hief Electoral Officer of Canada Stéphane Perrault announced on Friday that there will be a judicial recount of the votes in the electoral district of Brome-Missisquoi.

Liberal candidate Pascale St-Onge was declared the winner of the riding.

Following a validation of the results, however, the difference between the two leading candidates

was 197 votes. Marilou Alarie, candidate for the Bloc Québécois who came second, requested the recount.

The recount will be conducted by Justice Claude Dallaire of the Superior Court of Quebec and will begin on Tuesday, Oct. 12, 2021, at 175 Principale Street, Suite 25, Cowansville, Quebec, in the judicial district of Bedford. The results of the recount will be published on Elections Canada's website after the recount is completed.
