The meal was prepared by Shannon and served by him and volunteers, Julia Has-tings and Real Forget. look after this portion of the event and since the food was all do-nated by Derby and Eldridge, this saved on expenses and added to the total raised.

The big surprise of the day was the efforts put in by the SADD youth who are younger in age this year than the normal SADD youth board. Alexis Eldridge (whose parents have also been in programs since they were very young), was able to raise a record amount of \$1,500! Encouraged by generous donors who offered her additional donations as she reached certain goals in her efforts, Alexis was de-termined to raise more than \$1,000 and she certainly did it! The second place fundraiser was Dakota Paige with a whopping \$420 raised!

"The youth are encouraged to try and raise \$50 to \$75 each for a fundraiser of the sort," said Youth Coordinator, Ethan Ball. "Every one of these kids raised three to four times that amount each and I couldn't be prouder," he added.

The grand total reached thanks to the support of friends, family, neighbours, the youth themselves and generous business person as well as CABMN Board and committee members was, \$3,160!!! funds will enhance the equipment, programs and activities for the kids taking part in SADD, Mayo/Jam, dance, drop-in and more....

Games throughout the included, "write a group article for the newspaper/phrase scramble," ball and burn, charades, draw and guess, jib/ jab Christmas fun and more... At the end of the activity prizes were drawn with everyone who participated receiving a gift for their efforts.
