Missisquoi north volunteer centre (CABMN) celebrates volunteers of the year

t its Annual Volunteer Party Celebration held on Dec. 5 in the hall of the Feather in the Wind Senior Centre in Mansonville, the Missisquoi North Volunteer Centre (CABMN) celebrated the efforts of its over 260 active volunteers from Potton, Bolton-Est, Saint-Etienne-de-Bolton, Eastman and Stukely. A wine and cheese party with speeches and fun was organized and gave volunteers the opportunity to exchange and celebrate their collective efforts as part of the CABMN.

Since 2016 the CABMN has honored volunteers who have contributed a number of hours of volunteer time through the organization with the Karen Muzerall Memorial Volunteer of the Year Award. Karen Muzerall came from Miramichi in New Brunswick and was the wife of former Potton Mayor, Jacques Marcoux. Volunteering and community betterment were important to Karen and following her death after a courageous battle with cancer, the award was created in her memory to honor others who work toward this goal in helping their communities.

If organizations were to put a dollar value to the contributions made by volunteers in a variety of tasks the result would likely be astounding! For example, the CABMN has long encouraged its over 270 registered volunteers to enter their hours on its "track if forward" system and while only half have registered documenting each hour contributed, we can clearly see the story this tells us. Last year at the CABMN, 131 volunteers documented 4,235 hours and if we multiply that by a modest \$14.25 minimum wage rate the result is \$60,350 dollars!!!! This is an extremely telling statistic! Organizations like the CABMN volunteer centre and others who request the aid of volunteers could not do all that they do without the remarkable efforts contributed in time; free of charge by these individuals.

This year, the CABMN recognized the efforts of four volunteers and their contributions. Jean Pierre Gauvin who is a volunteer from Eastman who, being
