Plymouth-Trinity Church declines purchase offer by Sporobole artist's center

**P**lymouth-Trinity Church will not be selling their property to Sherbrooke artistic organization Sporobole, which had sought to turn it into a "creative hub". Jack Eby, a member of the Church's congregation and a member of its governing committee, put it simply: "we had a criteria for sale, they weren't able to match it." Eby refused to elaborate on the precise details, but stated that Sporobole "didn't communicate with us much."

"All I know is that it was more complicated for them due to [the] number of organizations [involved]," said Eby when asked why he thought this was so.
